## **ABC CITES CLERK FOR SELLING ALCOHOL TO MINORS**

**(Seaside)** – Investigators of the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) have cited one person for selling alcohol to a minor. The action was the result of a compliance check operation in which minors under the direct supervision of the investigators, attempted to purchase alcohol from retail licensees in Seaside and Del Rey Oaks. The minor attempted to purchase alcohol from seven locations in Seaside and two locations in Del Rey Oaks. One licensed business sold alcohol to the minor in Seaside, none sold in Del Rey Oaks.

Those who sold to the minor face a maximum fine of \$250, and/or 24 to 32 hours of community service for a first violation. In addition, ABC will take administrative action against the business's liquor license. That may include a fine, a suspension of the liquor license, or the permanent revocation of the license.

ABC is conducting the compliance checks state-wide to reduce the availability of alcohol to minors. Young people under the age of 21 have a higher rate of drunk driving fatalities than the general adult population.

Minor Decoy operations have been conducted by local law enforcement throughout the state since the 1980's. When the program first began, the violation rate of retail establishments selling to minors was as high as 40 to 50 percent. When conducted on a routine basis, the rate has dropped in some cities as low as 10 percent or even below. The latest violation rate state-wide is almost 16 percent.

In 1994, the California Supreme Court ruled unanimously that use of underage decoys is a valid tool of law enforcement to ensure that liquor licensees are complying with the law.
