ABC TARGETS ADULTS WHO FURNISH ALCOHOL TO MINORS

Investigators from the Salinas Office of the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) arrested two suspects last night in the City of Seaside for furnishing alcoholic beverages to minors.

The investigators conducted a program called a Decoy Shoulder Tap Operation which targets adults who purchase alcohol for people under 21 years of age. Under the program, a minor under the direct supervision of a peace officer will stand outside a liquor or convenience store and ask patrons to buy them alcohol. The minor indicates in some way he or she is underage and cannot purchase the alcohol.

If the adults comply, investigators then arrest and cite them for furnishing alcohol to the minor. The State Legislature recently increased the penalty for furnishing alcohol to a minor from a \$250 dollar fine to a minimum \$1,000 fine and 24 hours of community service.

The program is intended to reduce the availability of alcohol to minors who have a higher rate of drunk driving crashes than adults in general. According to the American Medical Association, underage drinking can increase chances of risky sexual behavior and teen pregnancy, juvenile delinquency, compromise health, and result in unintentional injury and death.
