## **ABC Cites Four Individuals for Selling Alcohol to Minors**

*ABC Investigators visit 17 Folsom locations and 12 Citrus Heights Locations*

**(Folsom-Citrus Heights)** - Investigators of the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) cited three clerks in Folsom and one in Citrus Heights for selling alcohol to a minor during a law enforcement operation. The actions were the result of a compliance check operation on Saturday, March 25, 2006, in which minors under the direct supervision of ABC Investigators, attempted to purchase alcohol from 17 retail licensees in the city of Folsom and 12 locations in Citrus Heights.

The clerks who sold to the minor face a minimum fine of \$250, and/or 24 to 32 hours of community service for a first violation. In addition, ABC will take administrative action against the business's liquor licenses. That may include a fine, a suspension of the liquor license, or the permanent revocation of the license.

ABC is conducting the compliance checks state-wide to reduce the availability of alcohol to minors. Young people under the age of 21 have a higher rate of drunken driving fatalities than the general adult population.

Minor Decoy operations have been conducted by local law enforcement throughout the state since the 1980's. When the program first began, the violation rate of retail establishments selling to minors was as high as 40 to 50 percent. When conducted on a routine basis, the rate has dropped in some cities as low as 10 percent or even below. The latest violation rate state-wide is almost 24 percent, or nearly one in five retail licensees selling to minors.

In 1994, the California Supreme Court ruled unanimously that use of underage decoys is a valid tool of law enforcement to ensure that liquor licensees are complying with the law.
