ABC Cites Clerk for Selling Alcohol To A Minor

(El Cajon)- Investigators of the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) cited a clerk for selling alcohol to a minor on May 26, 2006. The action was the result of a minor decoy operation in which a minor under the direct supervision of department investigators and the El Cajon Police, attempted to purchase alcohol from ten retail licensees in the City of El Cajon.

Those who sell to a minor face a minimum fine of \$250, and/or 24 to 32 hours of community service for a first violation. In addition, ABC will take administrative action against the business's alcohol license. That may include a fine, a suspension of the license, or the permanent revocation of the license.

ABC is conducting the compliance checks state-wide to reduce the availability of alcohol to minors. Statistics have shown that young people under the age of 21 have a higher rate of drunken driving fatalities than the general adult population.

Minor Decoy operations have been conducted by local law enforcement throughout the state since the 1980's. When the program first began, the violation rate of retail establishments selling to minors was as high as 40 to 50 percent. When conducted on a routine basis, the rate has dropped in some cities as low as 10 percent or lower. In 1994, the California Supreme Court ruled unanimously that use of underage decoys is a valid tool of law enforcement to ensure that licensees are complying with the law.

ABC and the El Cajon Police worked with Communities Against Substance Abuse, a non-profit prevention organization in East San Diego County. CASA hosts monthly "Licensee Education on Alcohol and Drugs" training to help educate the business community on alcohol laws., The non-profit group helped organize the media ride along for this decoy operation.
